

Peterborough Community Secondary School Admission Arrangements 2009

The determined 2009 admission arrangements for Peterborough Community Secondary Schools are as follows.

Bushfield Community College

The Local Authority will give priority to children with a statement of Special Educational Needs which names the school. This will be in addition to any specific arrangements to specialist provision.

1. Children in Care.
2. Verified medical need relating to the pupil (the requirements are strict and need certification by a Doctor or Psychologist).
3. Children living in the catchment area for these primary schools: Matley, Orton Wistow, St John's Orton, Winyates.
4. The attendance of a brother or sister on the college roll at the time of admission.
5. Children living outside the above area measured as a straight line, from the home address to the school's nearest official point(s) of entry.

PAN for Year 7 = 130

PAN for Year 12 = 40

Hampton College

The Local Authority will give priority to children with a statement of Special Educational Needs which names the school. This will be in addition to any specific arrangements to specialist provision.

1. Children in Care.
2. Verified medical need relating to the pupil (the requirements are strict and need certification by a Doctor or Psychologist).
3. Children living in the catchment area for these primary schools: Hampton Hargate, Hampton Vale.
4. The attendance of a brother or sister on the college roll at the time of admission.
5. Children living outside the above area measured as a straight line, from the home address to the school's nearest official point(s) of entry.

Ken Stimpson Community School:

5. Children living outside the above area measured as a straight line, from the home address to the school's nearest official point(s) of entry.

The Voyager School:

3. The attendance of a brother or sister on the school roll at the time of admission.
4. Children living in the catchment areas for these primary schools: Discovery, Eyrescroft, Fulbridge (West of Lincoln Road), Gunthorpe, Norwood, Paston Ridings (North of Soke Parkway), The Beeches (West of Lincoln Road), Watergall.
5. Children living outside the above area measured as a straight line, from the home address to the school's nearest official point(s) of entry.
