- Every pre 20th century building was built in stone. In contrast, twentieth century buildings are invariably in brick or render until the last 15 years when the use of stone has resumed, but only in the conservation area
- In most cases, the choice of modern brick has not reflected either the "Stamford" bricks or the Cambridgeshire whites traditional used in neighbouring villages of Maxey, Peakirk etc.
