### **Admission Arrangements – Orton Longueville School September 2010**

In accordance with the School Admissions (Admission Arrangements) Regulations 2008, the Governing Body of Orton Longueville School are undertaking a consultation process on the proposed admission arrangements for the Academic Year, commencing September 2010.

The following admission criteria are proposed

1. Looked After children (children in public care)
2. Children with professionally verified medical needs as certified by a doctor or psychologist
3. Children living in the catchment area of Orton Longueville School.
4. Where the child has a brother or sister attending the school at the time of admission
5. Children living nearest to the school as measured by a straight line. The distance is measured using the Council's Geographic Information System (GIS) Ordnance Survey (OS) seed point located at the child's home address to the OS seed point from the school, using a straight line.
6. In the event of the number of applications exceeding the number of places available, priority will be given to those children living nearest to the school as measured by a straight line as indicated above.

The Published Admission Number for years 7 to 11 will be 235 in 2010.

### **Sixth Form (Year 12)**

The Published Admission Number for external applications to Year 12 in 2010 will be 35.

Students will be admitted to Year 12 if they have obtained the academic entry requirements for their chosen programme of study at Orton Longueville School.
