Support for families

Help is available for women, children and men who are dealing with domestic violence or abuse in Peterborough. Domestic violence or abuse can take many forms such as: physical abuse, emotional/psychological abuse, sexual abuse, harassment, financial abuse, spiritual abuse.

Domestic violence is a crime. Domestic violence or abuse can happen to anyone regardless of gender or sexual orientation. Children who witness or are aware of domestic violence/abuse in the family are affected in a number of ways. The first step is to talk to someone. Never hesitate to call the police

> [Women's Aid \(http://www.peterboroughwomensaid.co.uk/\)](http://www.peterboroughwomensaid.co.uk/) (also now known as SASP – Specialist Abuse Services Peterborough) is an independent charity run to help women, men and children who are experiencing, at risk of or have been affected by domestic violence/abuse. You can speak to them confidentially about your worries and they can offer practical and emotional support or help to find emergency refuge accommodation if you are escaping abuse

How to access support

[Peterborough Relationship Support \(http://www.peterboroughrelationshipsupport.com/\)](http://www.peterboroughrelationshipsupport.com/) specialises in relationship counselling and offers a 17 week therapeutic support programme called 'Stop The Hurt' for perpetrators of domestic abuse.

The programme aims to teach positive, non-abusive ways to handle conflict situations and promote healthy relationships.
