A Peterborough resident has been fined over £500 after pleading guilty to fly tipping.

On Wednesday 1 July 2015 Mr Marian Igmuth now of Crawthorne Street, Peterborough appeared before Peterborough Magistrates Court and pleaded guilty to the charge of unlawfully depositing controlled waste.

He was fined £265 based on his means and ordered to pay costs of an additional £250 which included the council investigation and clear up costs, as well as a victim surcharge of £27.

The prosecution followed a city council investigation which found evidence in a large fly tip consisting of furniture, glass and cardboard that had been left on a path in Cromwell Road, Peterborough. The evidence found led enforcement officers to an address on the same street.



Marian Igmuth was then interviewed by council enforcement officers after evidence found was linked to his previous address in Cromwell Road. The matter was referred to Peterborough Magistrates Court and Igmuth duly pleaded guilty as charged.
